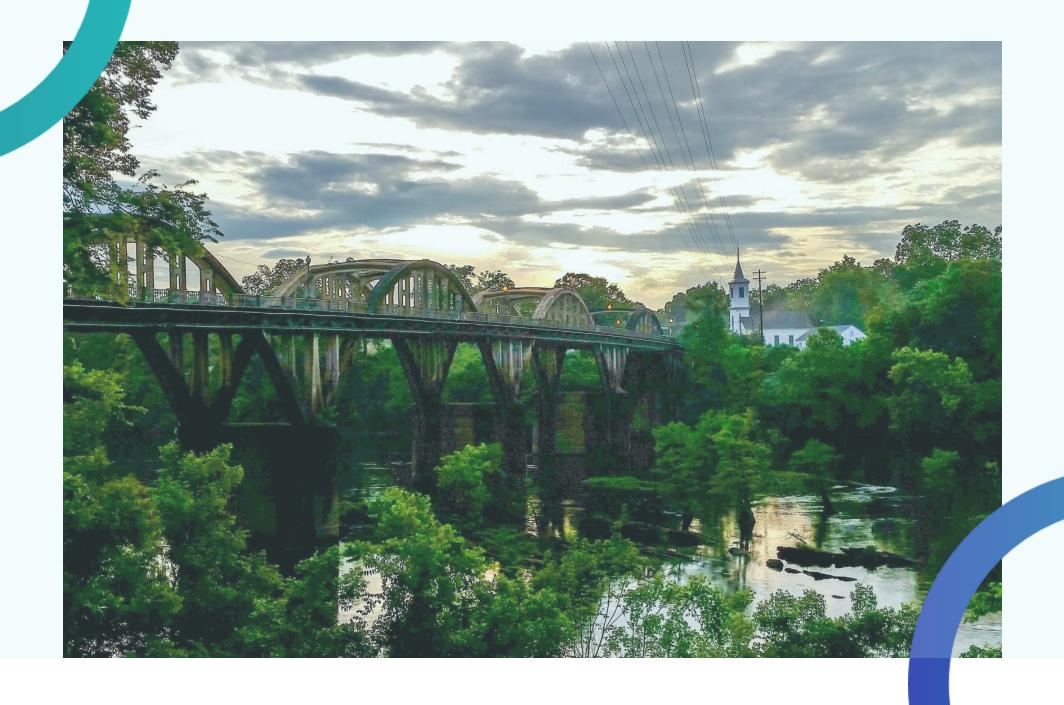

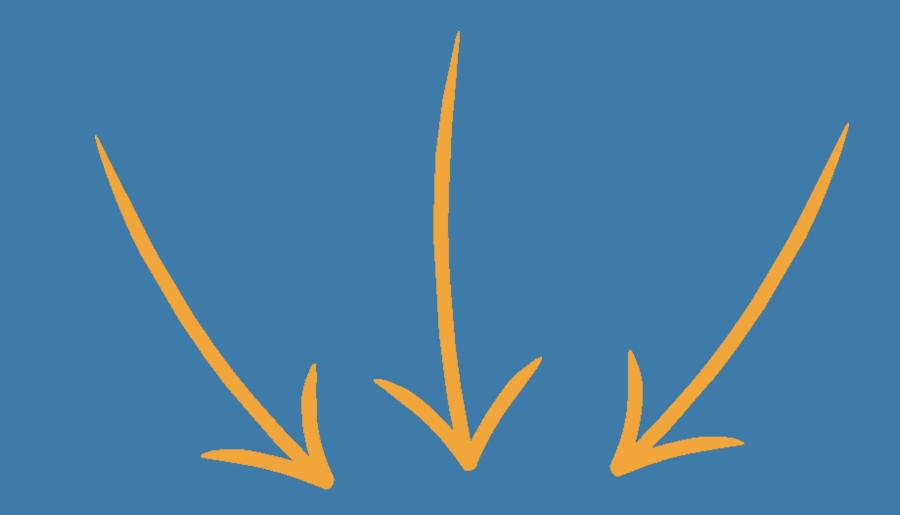

We had no idea how many people and hours it takes to produce a television show

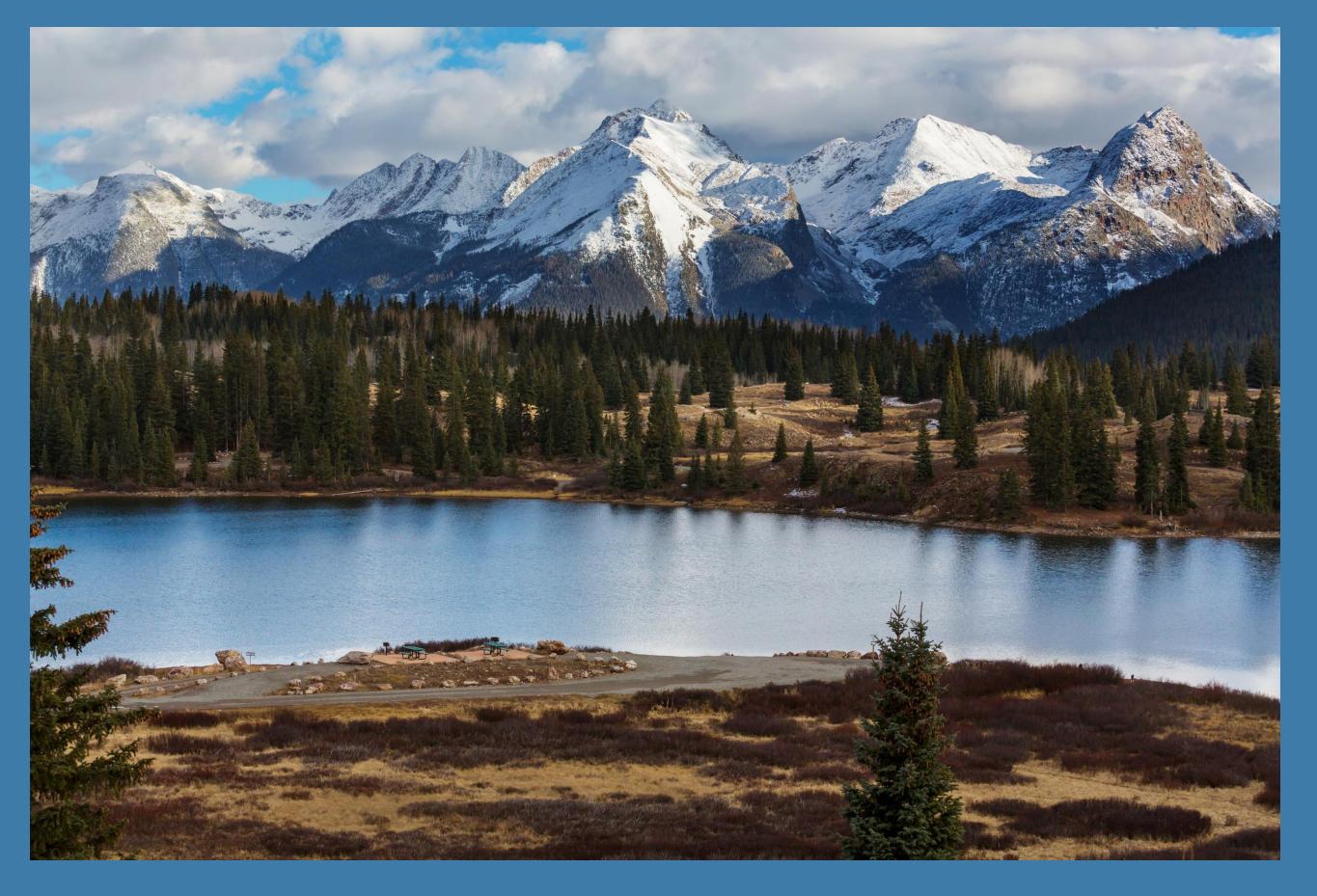

Like so many small towns across America, the evolution of the shopping mall had taken its toll.

In the defined Commercial Business District Revitalization Area, 56 commercial businesses were in operation in 1990. In 2011, only 15 of those 56 businesses remain open, representing a 74% decline in existing businesses, or a total loss of 41 businesses. Over the last 10 years, 21 of these businesses closed, demonstrating a consistent rate of business loss over the past two decades, with 20 closing in the 1990s and 21 closing in the most recent decade.
